We have decided to celebrate this with a small dinner at Suze in Mayfair, where Tom and Sue Glynn have put together a menu with a New Zealand theme, as well as a number of choices for those who want to try something different. We cannot duplicate the toheroa soup which featured at the early dinners, along with

New Zealand trout, lamb and apples. But we can do a lot better so far as New Zealand wine is concerned. Tom and Sue have selected some of their more interesting bottles to make a real 'menu degustation'.

The evening will start at 6.30 pm with canapes and a glass of Pelorus from the Society's cellars, so there will be an opportunity to mix and talk both before and after the dinner, which will be served at 7 pm.

Numbers are limited (either 30 or 50), but we are looking forward to seeing a representative selection of past-Presidents, former committee members and friends both old and new. HISTORIC MAORI FLAGPOLE TO MOVE AFTER 85 YEARS

A top New Zealand conservator is flying 12,000 miles to Britain to advise Cambridge University's Museum of Archaeology & Anthropology on how to move and restore an important piece of Maori heritage carved by his great grandfather and standing in obscurity at a Portsmouth naval shore base for 85 years.

James Schuster, 56, from Rotorua, is a direct descendent of Maori carver Tene Waitere who originally carved intricate patterns of figures holding traditional weapons onto a flagpole presented in April 1920 to HRH Edward, Prince of Wales - later King Edward VIII, the monarch who ruled for 326 days before abdicating to marry Wallis Simpson. The prince was on a long tour of the British Empire and spent four weeks in New Zealand.

The flagpole - known to the Maori people as a pouhaki - was originally given to the Prince at a great Maori welcome in Rotorua during his official visit to New Zealand. It was later handed over to the Royal Navy's shore base, HMS Excellent on Portsmouth's Whale Island, when Edward returned to England in 1922.

The pole has been a feature of Whale Island's rose garden ever since, but its origins have been known to only a few interested ethnologists and descendants of Tene Waitere. But in recent years Tene has been recognized as one of the greatest Maori carvers of the colonial period. The bold and innovative works he produced, often in collaboration with other carvers, include others now located far from his New Zealand homeland and found in the grounds of Clendon Park, Surry, London's British Museum and museums in Hamburg, Stuttgart and St. Petersburg.

Tene's great-grandson, James Schuster, a Maori heritage advisor to New Zealand's Historic Places Trust, saw the flagpole for the first time in September 2006 while visiting to the UK. Although well preserved, despite decades of exposure to British weather, it was obvious that a work of such significance needed to be relocated. Professor Nicholas Thomas, a historian of Pacific art and Director of Cambridge University's Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology, learned of the pole's existence from Schuster and offered to provide a permanent home for it at the University of Cambridge's museum.

"Over the first decades of contact in the 19th century, Maori were quick to emulate European symbols of sovereignty such as flags and flagpoles," said Professor Thomas. "Pouhaki became a feature in many Maori communities, but the boldly carved Portsmouth flagpole is of special importance. It is one of just two or three known to have been carved by Tene and is probably the oldest surviving anywhere - and the only one outside of New Zealand."

The flagpole re-location project is being supported and funded by the Ministry of Defence's Art Collection and Schuster and his wife Cathy are flying to Britain at the end of the month to oversee the excavation and transportation of the flagpole to its new home in Cambridge. Their visit is supported the New Zealand Link Foundation, and New Zealand Historic Places Trust.

After a period of conservation, the pouhaki will join other great works of native heritage such as a Haida totem pole in permanent galleries at the Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology in Cambridge.
